

Looking back over the past year also calls for that special “Kodak Moment” caught on film. I think you will agree this picture captures what it is all about!




Our Scouts are so fortunate to be a part of a village like none other. They have their Troop 1 Family - a special brotherhood of Scout buddies

Fowl Fest 2013


Pardon the pun, but Fowl Fest 2013 was another Barn Burner of a year!






